Child Audit Department Gets County Compliment

Compliments received in a letter from the county superintendent's office brought plaudits to the child auditing department of the Birmingham school district.

Specifically related are two women, Mrs. M. H. Stevens, the child accountant and Mrs. William Dove, who are the department's complete staff.

In a recent sampling audit of 2,965 pupils chosen at random from the 7,814 in membership, no error whatsoever was found either in record or numbers claimed.

AS RESULT of the accurate sampling, William J. Emerson, county superintendent of schools, in a letter to the city board of education, reported that the "child accounts of Birmingham are correct and in good order and comply with the laws of Michigan."

"This office has no recommendations to make concerning improvement of your already excellent child accounting system," said Emerson.

Dwight B. Ireland, Birmingham superintendent of schools, commented to the board that "all due credit for the excellent job must be given to Mrs. Stevens and Mrs. Dove."

MRS. STEVENS, who is the child accountant, keeps a constant check on every single child in the school district with a systematic method of her own.

"From the fourth Friday of the school year when the official enrollment is sent to the auditing department, we find the most effective method of audit is the weekly report of entries and with-

Greyhound Lists Routes' Changes

Effective June 1, Greyhound suburban coaches on the Birmingham and Mt. Clemens divisions will be assigned new routes through downtown Detroit and no longer will load and unload at the Greyhound terminal on Washington.

The change in routes is being made as a direct result of a survey made three weeks ago. In this survey the company's commuter patrons voted three-to-one for the more convenient downtown traffic pattern, according to J. V. Murphy, vice president and general traffic manager of Great Lakes Greyhound Lines.

BUSES FROM Pontiac, Birmingham and Royal Oak will come down Woodward to Jefferson, looping back to Woodward via Jefferson, Griswold and Larned. Boarding points for the outbound trip will be on Jefferson, between Woodward and Griswold and on Woodward just north of Grand River. Mt. Clemens division coaches will proceed in on Grand River, then loop back to Grand River via Randolph, Monroe, Michigan Ave., Washington Boulevard and Grand River. Buses will be on Monroe at Liberty in front of the Crowley Milner store, near Washington Blvd. between Grand River and Clifford.

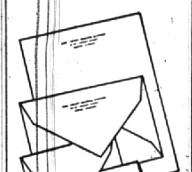

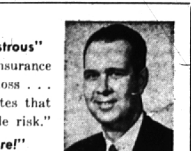
