Episcopal Bishop To Address Grads

Commencement speaker at the June 11 graduation at Cranbrook school will be the Rt. Rev. Richard S. M. Emrich, bishop of the Episcopal diocese of Michigan. Cranbrook Headmaster Harry D. Hoey made the announcement this week.

Widely known through Michigan and the Episcopal diocese as an author and lecturer, Bishop Emrich has headed the diocese since 1948. He had previously spent 10 years on the Episcopal Theological school faculty at Cambridge, Mass. He served two years as suffragan bishop in Michigan, also.

In addition to several honorary degrees from colleges and universities, the bishop holds a doctorate of philosophy from the University of Marburg, Germany, where he did graduate work after receiving his theological training at U. of T. in seminary and Episcopal theological school.
