## 'Develop Yourselves,' Speaker Tells Grads

"I think the words of your charming Jean Ruslander's song are most fitting at this time," Dr. William Whitcomb Whitehouse, Alton college president, told the 204 members of Birmingham high school's Class of '35 last Thursday.

He referred to the vocal solo sung by a member of the class, and the title of the Rodgers and Hammerstein hit, "You'll Never Walk Alone."

"You," he told the class, "will never walk alone because the Almighty God is always with you. Have confidence in yourself through God. Believe in Him and let Him guide you."

DR. WHITEHOUSE, a native of England, speaks with a flipped British accent, and appears to be talking directly to each person within his hearing.

He said, confidence would give courage; courage permits alertness and the alert person is successful.

"God has given you many gifts. Have the courage to use them to meet the world challenge."

"In your Birmingham schools you have a magnificent background of learning. Use it—all as you surge forward to the new frontiers of today. Meet these frontiers and push them backward."

"FACE THE future with every power and talent at your command. Have faith in yourself, your fellowman and the world and your courage will help you forge a better life for all."

He spoke of the dynamics and need of modern living and how it can confuse the sense of direction.

"Don't let the softness of life bewilder you," he told the class. "Set your sights on a goal and keep pushing toward it in the words of Margaret Ryan Johnson:

"Create your own tomorrow." "We have accomplished more good in the past two years, in spite of rumors of war and general chaos, than we did in the ten years before this."

"This is because young men and women, like yourselves, have had the courage to go on, challenging new fields, accepting the responsibilities they have found there without hesitation."

IN CONCLUSION, Dr. Whitehouse stressed again that the keys to success are courage, alertness, faith, resourcefulness, confidence and an abiding trust in God.

"With these things, plus the gifts God already has given you in training of your own intelligence, you cannot help but leave your mark and make your community and the world better for your having lived."
