

Cellar Teams Blast Pacemakers in LL

Changes took place in all of the Little League standings with cellar dwelling teams moving into the limelight by handing the leaders in each loop serious setbacks.

An upheaval took place in the American league with the previously unbeaten Tigers dropping four straight games and the Indians winning three in a row to move into a first place tie with the Red Sox for the league lead.

THE YANKEES broke into the victory column at the expense of the Tigers by taking two from the Bengals including an 8-4 decision in which Dave McManus and Doug Walton homered after trailing by three runs.

Another defeat for the Tigers came at the hands of the Red Sox, 6-2, with mound ace Carl Kelsey and Mike Jackson facing each other. The Tigers can become spoilers in the next week having two games with the Indians and another game with the Red Sox on the schedule.

UPHEAVALS also took place in the other two leagues with the cellar dwelling Senators moving into the Federal loop race with a pair of surprising victories, and the National league leaders, the Pirates and Braves, both taking it on the chin.

The previously unbeaten White Sox were handed two defeats, 15-3 by the Athletics and 8-3 by the Senators.

BOB CARROLL, slugging third baseman for the Athletics, who leads the Little League batting with .611 drove in eight runs and had two homers among his three hits in leading his team to a 15-3 win over the White Sox.

Against the Orioles, Carroll slammed another homer but his team lost a 6-1 decision. The Cubs topped the National league games by belting the Pirates and Braves, two teams that

led the league last week. A one hit pitching performance by Walker in seven innings gave the Cubs a 6-4 win over the Pirates and hitting of outfielder and pitcher Maxwell was a big factor in the 4-1 victory over the Braves.

THE GIANTS broke into the win column by edging the Pirates 7-6 behind the four hit pitching of Howling and the hitting of shortstop Perry who had two doubles in three hits and two runs batted in.

Orioles Whipped The White Sox strengthened their hold on first place in the Federal league with a 10-2 victory over the Orioles Tuesday. Van Guesen gave up six hits to get credit for two wins.
