### Senate Rejects MTA Chairman

William E. Slaughter Jr., chairman of the controversial Michigan Turnpike Authority, was removed as MTA head when the state senate refused to confirm his appointment to the job he has held for two years.

By a 5-to-15 vote Monday, state senators led by William Broomfield (R-RO) and Patrick J. Doyle (D-DeARBORN), rejected Slaughter because of the recent battle over the 113-mile Rockwood to Saginaw toll road.

Slaughter, of 32949 Bingham Lane, Southfield township, said on learning of the senate action: "I have learned successful business practices have little place in government business."

IRONICALLY, it was the weight of Slaughter's own party, the Republicans, who caused his downfall, despite the backing of Gov. G. Mennen Williams and five Democratic senators.

Slaughter's action is another good reason why it is hard to get qualified citizens to serve the state," said Williams.

"Mr. Slaughter is a highly qualified and highly successful Republican businessman. He served the state without compensation. He tackled his job with vigor and with great courage. He gave the state the very best he had," said Williams.

Said Slaughter: "My one regret as a lifetime Republican is that the action was taken by the Republican party without one word of explanation or a word of thanks."

"Within six months the authority will sell its bonds and will start work on Michigan's greatest highway, the north-south turnpike. "I will be content to wait until that day comes, (when the highway is completed) for it will be a reward beyond any other for my action in a much-needed program."

Frederick has been assistant chief engineer of Chevrolet since 1952. He first joined the GM staff as a research engineer in 1923, after graduation from the University of Michigan. He has been with Chevrolet since 1932, serving as truck engineer, design engineer and chief aviation engineer.
