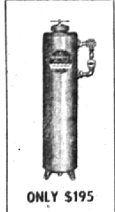

African Educator Hails L.I.T. And American System

SOUTHFIELD The American competitive system, even in education, is a very healthy thing, according to Astor Rowland Williams, newly appointed director of one of the largest colleges in the world, the Witwatersrand Technical College of Johannesburg, South Africa, which has an enrollment of 75,000.

During his visit to Lawrence Tech's new campus at Northwood in Highway and Ten Mile Road, he told L.I.T. President E. George Lawrence of 1406 Middlesex, Lathrop Village.

"I'm wonderful that American colleges compete not only on the Athletic field but in the academic world. This keeps educators on their toes and results in the highest quality of programs and activities."

Williams, who is touring the United States under the auspices of the American Council of Education, is a participant in the foreign leader program of the International Educational Exchange Service of the U. S. Department of State. After inspecting the new building and campus, where Lawrence Tech will move in time for September classes, Williams was started to find that ten acres of land had been set aside for parking facilities.

"Wait until I tell my colleagues in South Africa about this," he said. "All we worry about is that our students have good public transportation and, even then, many walk or ride bicycles. They'll never believe that many of the Lawrence Tech students drive better and newer cars than their professors do."

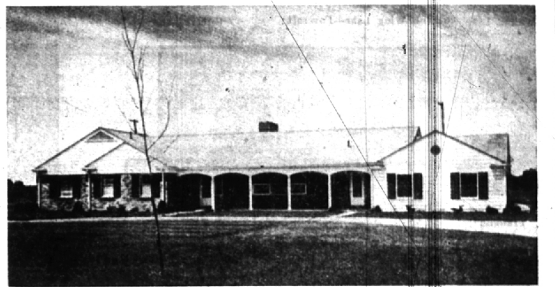

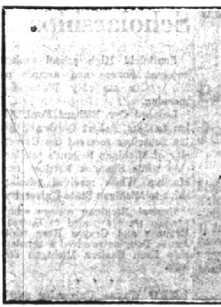
