Judge Tells What Delinquent Child Is

A delinquent child is an unwanted, unhappy, insecure child, observes Arthur E. Moore, who has ministered to the needs of delinquent, dependent and neglected children for 17 years as judge of probate in Oakland county.

Speaking before members of the Oakland County Planned Parenthood at their annual meeting June 2, Moore cited many instances where parental rejection was the cause of juvenile delinquency.

"Happiness for any child, he said, comes from the essential security in a strong family relationship.

"I have never seen a delinquent youngster who wasn't the product of either the neglect of society or of the neglect of family or of the home," he emphasized.

In his court room he encounters pictures of family neglect. He has heard parents say to their child, "I never want to see you again!"

"And that," said Judge Moore, "is the cause of many neglected, rejected children."

"The father marries again," explained Moore, "and has children with his second wife. He doesn't care enough to support two families so the children of the first marriage suffer."

"The mother may want to keep her children, but in order to support them and herself, she goes to work and the youngsters roam the streets. Unless there is a good grandmother and grandfather to step in and provide the proper family life, the chances of those children turning out well are pretty slim."

To combat the increasing divorce rate, Moore believes there should be more education for marriage in the home, school and church.

"Preparation for marriage is a united family circle does a remarkable job in this respect and so does the Jewish family."

"IN ALL my 17 years," he said, "I have never had a delinquent from a Jewish family. I have talked with judges from New York City and find that the delinquency rate among Jewish children is the lowest among all groups. Education for marriage in the family circle does bear fruit."

Economics and living standards enter into the picture of neglected, rejected children, Moore pointed out.

"A family of eight or nine children coming here from the South finds the going pretty tough, even though the father earns more money in the North," he said.

"Living standards are higher, and chances are against them."

Moore believes in the sterilization of defectives.

"It isn't right," he said, "to further defective children into the world and while groups are against sterilization, believing in segregation instead, we must face the issue honestly and realistically."

"THERE JUST isn't enough room in our state institutions to take care of all our defectives. Boaming our streets right now are 900,000 mental defectives who should be admitted."
