Hails Support Of School Bond Issue

Official approval of the proposed \$5.5 million school bond issue by Birmingham-area branches of the League of Women Voters and the American Association of University Women was hailed this week as an encouraging indication that the school district will approve the offering at next Monday's election.
This was the comment of Marvin J. Brokaw, 1165 S. Bates, chairman of the independent Citizens Committee on Education.
"Support of these two influential and public-spirited organizations backs up the findings of our committee that the need for additional classrooms, modernizing of existing facilities and completion of two swimming pools for community use is based on facts and sound reasoning."
HE ADDED that growing support for the proposed building program also is evident among individual citizens throughout the district as they become familiar with the committee's studies and recommendations, which were followed closely by the board of education in drafting the bond proposal.
Reappointment of City Manager D. C. Egbert as Birmingham's delegate to the South Oakland and Garfield school authority and City Engineer L. R. Gate to the South Oakland water authority has been made by the city commission. DPW Supt. Robert Kenning again was named alternate to both groups.
