Mrs. Mae Brooks, Native Resident

A long time Birmingham resident, Mrs. Mae Ketcher Brooks, 82, 272 Ravine, died March 8 at her home.

Mrs. Brooks was born in Birmingham May 29, 1872. At an early age she moved to Kansas where she lived for a period of 12 years. On her return she made her home with her sister, Mrs. George Randall, mother of Charles B. Randall.

On March 6, 1895, she married Joseph Brooks of Southfield where they lived their entire married life of 50 years.

SURVIVORS include three daughters, Mrs. Robert Clifton of Bloomfield township, Mrs. Ralph Kreeger of Clarkston and Miss Blanche Brooks of Birmingham.

A son, Harry Brooks, chief test pilot for Ford Motor Company, was lost off the coast of Florida while on an experimental test flight in February, 1928, and another son died in infancy.

Mrs. Brooks has four grandchildren, three great-grandchildren, a sister, Mrs. Mary Huged of North Star, and several nieces and nephews, among whom is Dr. Clark D. Brooks of Detroit.

Eugene Parmenter Dies in Prison

Former holder, Eugene A. Parmenter, 34, died Feb. 28 in Jackson prison.

He died of cancer in the prison hospital, where he had been since he was taken last Nov. 8 to Jackson to serve from 7 1/2 to 10 years.

Parmenter served a minimum sentence of 1 1/2 to 1 1/2 years starting in 1931 following his conviction of embezzlement of funds while employed by the now defunct First State Savings bank in Birmingham.

Parmenter vanished in August, 1952, when state examiners arrived to audit books of the First State Investment Co. of Pontiac.

He was previously with the Detroit Trust company and Elmer Boy.

Surviving are his wife, the former Melva Curtis, two daughters, Diane and Sherry; a son, Matthew B. Jr.; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Matthew Whitlesy of Washington street; a sister, Mrs. James Joyce of Seaboard, Va.; and four brothers, John M. of West Maple, Dr. Robert H. of Cleveland Heights, Frederick D. of Tucson, Ariz. and George.

Funeral services were conducted Monday in California. A memorial service will be conducted here when his parents return from Florida where they are wintering.
