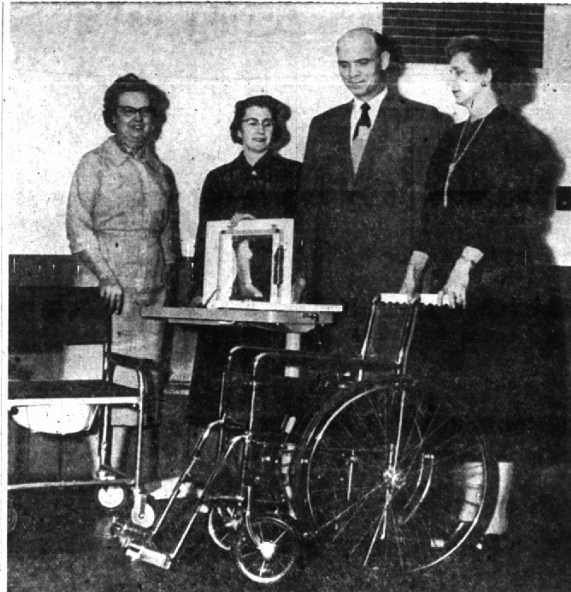

Community House Lists First Velma Isley Memorial Gifts

Early donations to the Velma Isley Memorial Fund at the Birmingham Community House have been earmarked to purchase supplies for the sickroom cupboard, a division in which Mrs. Isley had a deep interest.

At the time of her death last November her husband, Carlton H. Isley requested that a memorial fund be established at the House where she had served as director for seven years, instead of funeral flowers.

As a result the House today can offer a wheelchair for youngsters, a commode chair and a two-way bed table which can be raised or tilted for greater comfort and which has a small, easily accessible compartment for storing writing materials or other small items.

Mrs. George A. Wernholz and Mrs. Martin L. Butzel, who have worked with Carlton H. Isley in selecting these new items, spoke of the increased value the cupboard can be to the community because of them.

"THE TABLE, alone," Mrs. Butzel said, "is something that can give a great deal of service to anyone spending a great deal of time in bed but still capable of a certain amount of activity."

"The tilting top, the fact that the stand can be raised or lowered and the small storage space can do much toward making life easier for one in bed and for those taking care of him."

"The youth chair," Mrs. Weinhold commented, "is not only a new item, but the first we have had of this type. Never before have we been able to offer a child with a broken leg or other such injury a wheelchair for his size."

THE CUPBOARD can supply, without charge, many items to aid in caring for the ill at their homes. Supplies run from ice bags to a brace for a broken back; bedding to hospital beds; crutches to the wheelchairs. All are available on a "first come, first served" basis to anyone in the immediate area.

Individual donations and gifts from Birmingham organizations have supported the sickroom cupboard in the past.

Isley said some money still remained in the fund, and with any future contributions, would be spent on whatever need exists.

"An 'overflow' of the storage room and a system of more convenient storage may show up needs for items not now stocked. These will be added to the present inventory as quickly as possible.
