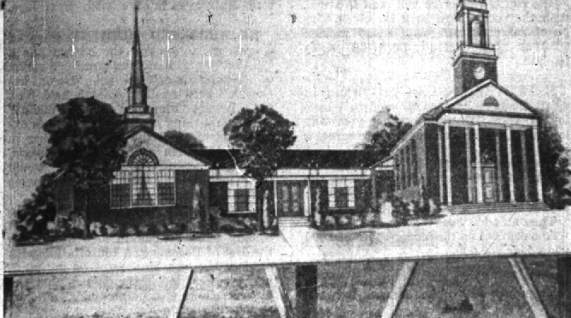


The New FRANKLIN COMMUNITY CHURCH WILL BE BUILT HERE
