## LWV to Hear Discussion of Taxes, Township Problems

The West Bloomfield League of Women Voters will hold a luncheon meeting at the township hall Tuesday, March 15, at 12:30 p.m. The program following the luncheon will be divided into two parts.

George W. Skrub, chairman of the Oakland County Planning commission will speak on, "To Incorporate or Not to Incorporate," a discussion of problems that township governments face because of the incorporation of small communities within their boundaries.

The League feels this problem, called "fragmentation," can become critical in a township growing as rapidly as West Bloomfield.
