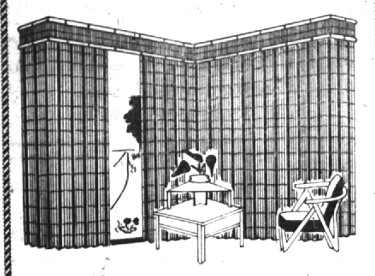


Have You Met

This will be the community's own blood bank, from which any member can be a receiver any time, anywhere. You are a member if you are a property owner in Wing Lake or Foxcroft.

If you or a member of your family need blood, call Mrs. Fuller. Some, due to physical reasons, are unable to donate. However, they are eligible to receive. HERE'S WHERE WE START SPREADING IT

First, a few words about IT.

We have been to Chicago and Lansing and are in touch with Michigan State College, Purdue and Cornell Universities and our County Agricultural Agent and here are a few tips.

1. The general ingredients (Nitrogen, Phosphorus and Potash) are the same. The proportion (10-6-4) is still the most valuable for lawns, 1-12-1 and 5-10-5 and 6-10-4 rate best for general garden purposes.

Some variation is due because of the variety of conditions and plants that are to be met.

2. Lawn fertilizers will present:—
 a) A one shot deal—highly advertised but not established as to efficacy.
 b) Addition of TRACE ELEMENTS—possibly one of the best steps forward.
 c) Liquids—will certainly do the job but require more labor and it MUST be done regularly.

3. After much cogitation we are recommending Woodruff's GRO-SOD and Stadler's XXX for lawns, Agrico's 5-10-5 and Stadler's GARD-N-GRO for gardens.

4. CRAB-GRASS and CHICKWEED CONTROLS.
 a) Two types, PRE-EMERGENCE and POST-EMERGENCE.

The post-emergence type is used after the plants can be seen. POTASSIUM CYANATE still looks best, New items such as SODAR and CHLORO-IPC do not carry the solid backing of the experimental stations as yet.

The pre-emergence type has already produced excellent results. It is mentioned now because its use requires an earlier application of lawn seed. ANY UN-GERMINATED SEEDS IN THE LAWN OR GARDEN WILL NOT GERMINATE AFTER THE CHEMICAL IS APPLIED. The chemical should be applied to lawns at least 6 weeks after reseeding and to gardens after all plants and seeds are several inches tall. CRAG is the product we will talk about later. BUT, get your lawn FERTILIZER and GRASS SEED spread NOW.

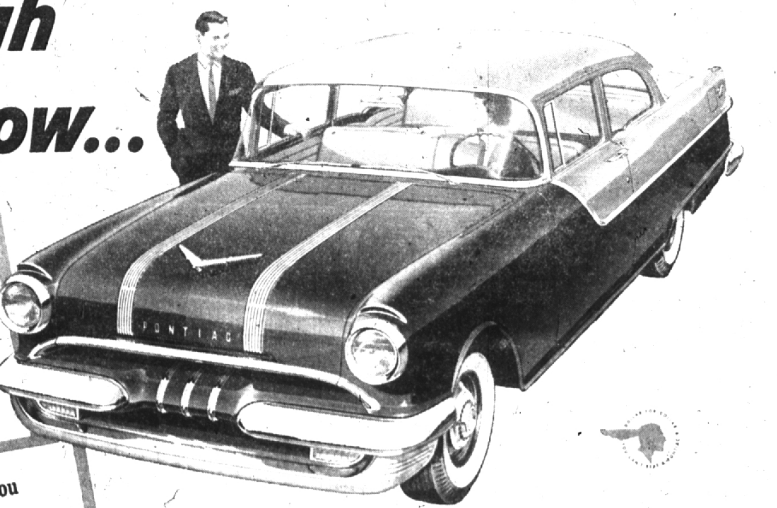
5. UNCOVERING FLOWER BEDS.
 DON'T uncover them yet. In fact, as we write this the temperature is 1 degree above zero (nearly Monday morning) and if you want to improve the condition of your narcissi and tulips you better get a bale of PEAT MOSS and cover them 1 to 2 inches deep.

6. SPREADING IT.
 At last a NEW SPREADER is available (and we don't mean the writer). It is named LAWN BEAUTY and is correctly designed, ruggedly built (not like the writer) and is capable of spreading accurately all kinds of materials from red top (7 million seeds to the pound) to peat moss.

7. BARGAIN
 The 30" Buch spreaders, which we loaned out last year are to be sold NOW. Retailing at \$16.50 you can steal them now at \$8.00. Also one 21" Master Spreader was \$39.95 and will go for \$12.00. There are only 4 Buchs and it will be "first come first served." They cannot be held by a telephone call pending your leisurely examination.
