

### Crane Cagers Local Groups Win Finale Meet Tonight On Ice Rink

Cranebrook's varsity basketball team wound up a highly successful season by "trouncing" Western Reserve Academy of Hudson, Ohio, 86 to 59, in a game played on the Cranebrook court. The Blue and Gray jumped into an early lead and their advantage grew to 45-34 at the half.

SHAW Emmons' deadly shooting and Owen Pett's strong rebounding soon pulled the game out of Reserve's grasp. The second half was the same story as Cranebrook outplayed the visitors, scoring 41 points to Reserve's 25. Jim Kinapp and Dave Turner, Cranebrook's co-captains, maintained the pressure.

A steady flow of substitutes could not keep the score down as coach Kenny cleared the bench. Senior Charles Dunkel scored six points and played brilliantly in the final stanza. Emmons tallied 28 points to lead all scorers, while Pett and Kinapp followed with 15 and 14 points respectively.

CRANEBOOK'S season record was a highly respectable 10 wins and 5 losses. Four of these defeats came by a total of 7 points. The Cranes finished second in the Inter-State League with a three and one record. Their only loss being a 63-60 decision to Cleveland University School. With several freshmen and some members returning, next season's prospects are excellent.
