

# 170 Scouts and Dads Attend Lathrup Event

"THAT in the event of the acquisition by the city of all properties in that block bounded by Merrill, Bates, Townsend and Hendricks streets in said city, and prior to the utilization of said "Shain Park" for a municipal parking lot, the city, acting through its commission, shall irrevocably dedicate said southerly block as a public park, such dedication to be in perpetuity, and to be changed only if approved by affirmative vote of the qualified electors of said city in the same manner required by the charter of the city of Birmingham for a public park.

"That in the event said southerly block shall be so dedicated as a public park, the city shall promptly commence the work of improving the same as a public park and shall carry such work to completion as expeditiously as is possible."
