Psychologist**

Dr. Harold F. Powell, associate professor of educational psychology and an expert on problems of juvenile delinquency, will speak to the members of the Torry PTA Tuesday, March 22nd, at 8 p.m. in the school auditorium.

Dr. Powell, who is a member of the Birmingham Youth Council, will discuss the delinquency danger from the standpoint of one who has spent many years studying and combating the problem.

SINCE 1946 a member of the Wayne University faculty, Dr. Powell has had long experience in the field of child psychology. Before going to Wayne, he spent a year as a visiting teacher at the Ella Observational school in Detroit.

Other working experience has included positions as school psychologist at the Detroit Psychological Clinic, teacher at the Moore school for Boys in Detroit, and psychometrist for the U. S. Armed Forces.

Dr. Powell is a graduate of Albion college and holds advanced degrees from both the University of Michigan and Wayne university. He is a member of Phi Delta Kappa, honorary educational fraternity.

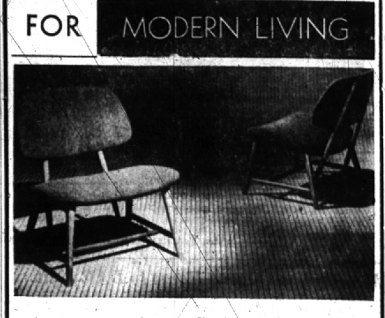

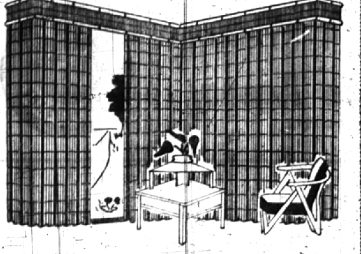
