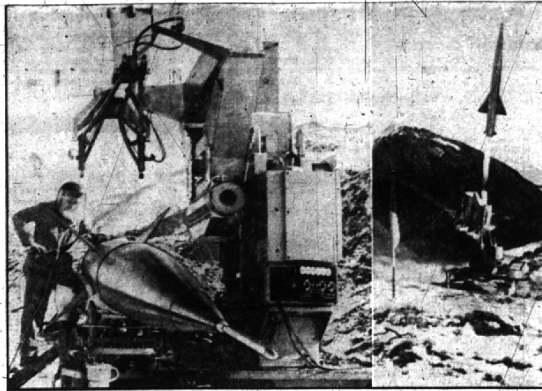
MICHIGAN LIFE LINES!

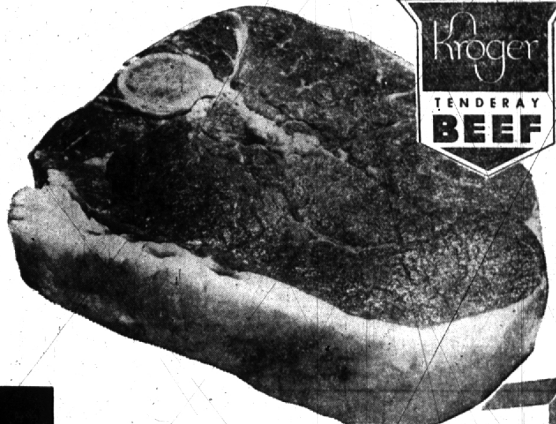
