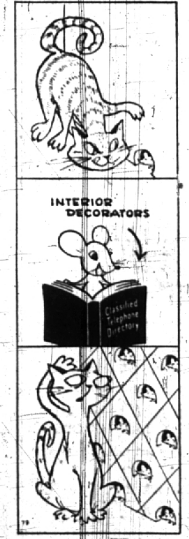
### BOX SUPPER

## Junior League Shop Aids Handicapped

Another facet in the Birmingham Junior League will be revealed March 22, when their League for the Handicapped shop is opened on Hamilton.

Sharing the building with Talent Unlimited, the new shop will feature merchandise made by handicapped persons in the metropolitan area.

Materials offered for sale will include nearly every field—from clothing to bedding and toys for the baby, table linens, travel sets, kitchen accessories, aprons, knitting bags and many other items in related fields will be available.

The League for the Handicapped, a Red Feather organization, is one which the Junior League helped organize and has since fostered, in their plan to help these persons help themselves.

PERSONS DEALING with the handicapped are aided in finding a field in which they can work and particular talents are developed to the fullest.

The partially blind, hard of hearing, physically handicapped and those suffering from heart conditions or other forms of illness which curtail physical activity are assisted by the group.

From the initial interview, everything possible is done to help the handicapped person to achieve maximum adjustment, physically, mentally, socially and vocationally.

A WORKSHOP is operated at the agency headquarters, 1401 Ash street, Detroit, where work skills and experience are advanced. Contract jobs in industrial sewing, hand assembly and industrial salvage takes up a good share of the program there.

For persons who cannot leave their homes light work is assigned which fits their talent and ability. In many instances these, and the men and women working in the agency shop, are eventually returned to society as self-supporting workers in various types of private industry.

Retail items are sold through shops such as the one opening in Birmingham next week.

Mrs. Robert L. Graham, chairwoman of the shop's opening, said Mrs. Frederick S. Ward and Mrs. Nelson Nolan, chairman of Junior League volunteers would supervise the establishment, with League volunteers as sales staff.

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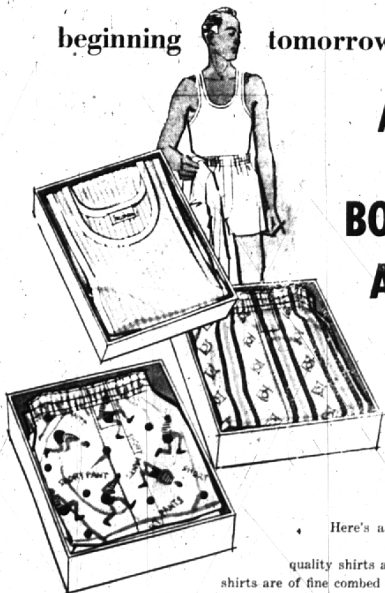
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



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
