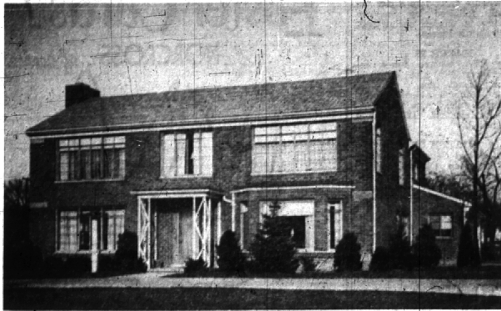


Dowd Recuperating
