

Rash of Auto Parts Larcenies Plague Birmingham Police

A 16-year-old Birmingham boy, arrested for investigation of larceny from an auto last week at the Birmingham Bowling Alley parking lot, has been turned over to his legal guardian after being placed on probation to Police Lt. Henry Timm.

The boy, according to Det. Robert Schulte, was arrested after an unidentified citizen noticed someone acting suspicious in the lot and phoned police. Patrolmen Bill Andrews and Lester Tallot made the arrest after they found the boy inside one of the cars.

"If parents would call us whenever they see something sus-

icious, as they did in this case, we might stop a lot more of this petty thieving," Schulte said. "We can't do much without cooperation from private citizens though."

Lt. Merin Holmquist, in charge of the detective bureau, said that 15 larceny from auto cases have been reported in Birmingham during the first half of March.

"During one four-day period we had 14 such cases," Holmquist said. "And these youths can completely clean a car of tires, wheels and accessories in seven minutes."
