MARCH MISCELLANY

If you are as procrastinating as we are at times, you will find that about now you are almost overwhelmed by the number of things that should be done in your yard to:

- 1) Give that beautiful, comfortable start that will endure throughout the seasons.
- 2) Get them done in time so that you can enjoy the fruits of your labors.

So get on your dungarees and get going.

- Spread WOODRUFF'S GRO-SOD or STADLER'S XXX on your lawn (both are 10-6-4 fertilizers) at the rate of 2 lbs. to 100 sq. ft.
- 2. Spread top quality GRASS SEED soon after the fertilizer. Grass should be DRY. - When using LIQUID LIME-SULPHUR as a DOR-MANT SPRAY it will stain painted surfaces.
- 4. DORMANT SPRAYS should be put on, on clear bright days when temperature is 45 degrees or over, no danger of freezing within 12 to 16 hours and before growth begins.
- 5. Bogonias, gloxinias, caladiums may be started indoors for planting outdoors about Memorial Day
- Average last hard frost date in this area is about
- 7. Plant roses in early spring. Your orders for North-ern Grown Roses should be placed immediately.
- 8. GET YOUR MOWER SHARPENED.
- Most people (and humans too) over-seed and under-fertilize their lawns. You cannot have a splendid turf if you cut down on the nourishment in order to cut down on the mowing.
- 10. Plant SWEET PEAS now. Use DRY CATTLE MANURE under them.
- 11. If your PEONIES have blasted in the past year spray soil with BORDEAUX as soon as covering is re-moved and then spray the young shoots after they appear and again 10 days later.
- 12. Uncover boxwood and evergreen plants. Best time is a cloudy day.
- 13. Nothing-in deference to the superstitious
- 14. Broadcast 4 lbs. of STADLER'S GARD-N-GRO (4-12-4) or AGRICO (5-10-5) in perennial beds.
