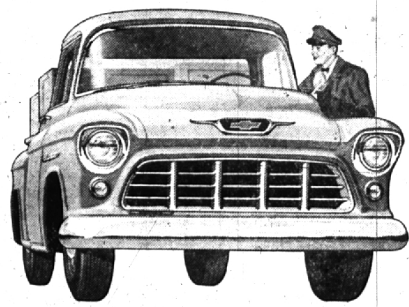
MARCH MISCELLANY

- 1. Give that beautiful, comfortable start that will endure throughout the seasons.
2. Get them done in time so that you can enjoy the fruits of your labors.
3. So get on your dungarees and get going.
