Blood Bank Heads Seek to Increase Summer Donations

Named to head the Oakland county chapter, American Red Cross, is Mrs. John Blanchard, 1466 Glenary road. She will serve until July 1, taking over the duties of Mrs. V. V. Van Fleet who has resigned the post.

Other localities on the committee are Mrs. Sheldon Noble of Birmingham and Mrs. James McCormick, Southfield. Mrs. Blanchard is working with county officials in an effort to book bloodmobile dates during July and August that will result in "banking" from 500 to 600 pints per month in order to meet seasonal demands.

Mrs. Dalton Siftman, registration committee chairman, said the high demands for blood are due to the accident increases during the summer. This, coupled with the fact that donor interest lags through the vacation period, leaves the blood bank facing critical shortages.
