The group will be hosted at Cranbrook school cabin by Mrs. William Schultz at 8 p.m., April 8. Her aides will be Catherine

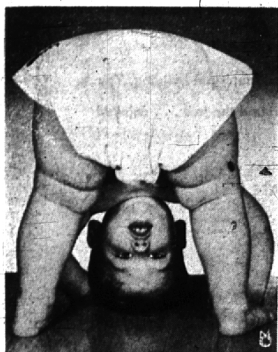
