Charter Amendment — Sewers and Drains
SHALL SECTION 1 OF CHAPTER XII OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM, STATE OF MICHIGAN, BE AMENDED TO PROVIDE THAT THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY MAY CONTRACT FOR THE DISPOSAL OF SEWAGE THROUGH A SYSTEM WHICH MAY BE ESTABLISHED BY THE COUNTY OF OAKLAND SUCH AS THE PROPOSED EVERGREEN INTERCEPTOR SYSTEM?

(Section 1 of Chapter XII is printed herewith as proposed, immediately followed by the Section as it now reads.)

Chapter XII Sewers and Drains
Section 1. The Commission may establish, construct and maintain a sewerage system, sewerage disposal system, sewers and drains wherever and wherever necessary. Such systems, sewers and drains may be constructed either within or without the city or partly within and partly without the city. The commission may contract with any other governmental unit or units for sewerage and drainage facilities, provided that any such contract other than one for the disposal of sewerage through the Southeastern Oakland County Sewage Disposal System, or any other system which may be established by the County of Oakland such as the proposed Evergreen Interceptor System, shall be approved by two-thirds of the electors voting thereon at a general or special election.

Amendment No. 5

RESOLVED, THAT SECTION 5 OF CHAPTER XIV OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF BLOOMFIELD HILLS, MICHIGAN, BE AMENDED AS FOLLOWS, TO WIT:

Section 5.
