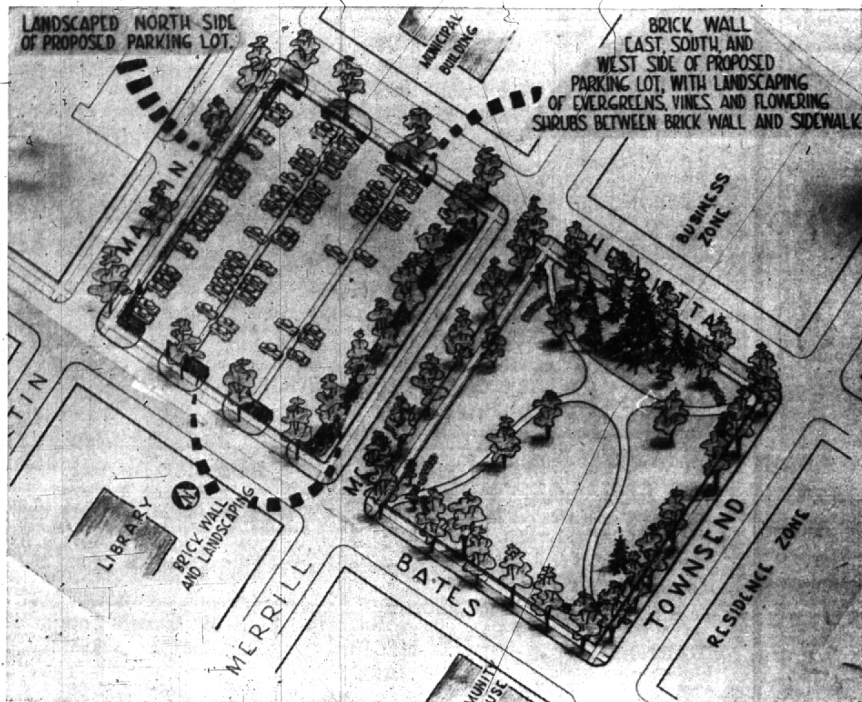

BACK YOUR CITY COMMISSION. Vote "YES" on Proposal No. 3 next Monday. Much time and expense has been devoted to secure the opinions and plans of experts to study Birmingham's business area and the future needs to make and keep it the shopping center of Birmingham residents. The culmination of their study is the recommendation that Birmingham's Shain Park be moved one block south.

IT IS A SOUND PLAN. First there is NO ASSURANCE that existing privately operated parking facilities will ALWAYS be as they are now. Changing commercial demands, changing property values could see these parking areas converted into business buildings. Proposal No. 3 DOES ASSURE the residents of Birmingham a PERMANENT, conveniently located parking lot. DOES ASSURE a Civic Park to retain the natural beauty of the Civic Area.

SHAIN PARK WILL BE RETAINED as a beautifully cared for functional central park. It will be dedicated to the use of Birmingham people. It will be re-located to add new natural loveliness to the Civic Center and will serve forever to keep commercial and business buildings from penetrating into the residential section. The plan makes the New Shain Park a focal point of serene, dignified beauty with a functional use for the people of Birmingham.

THE CITY OWNED PARKING FACILITIES created by this move will pay, along with businesses adjacent: for the entire development . . . there will be NO ADDED TAX BURDEN to the home owner. The present natural beauty of the area will be kept. Because of decay, age and storm damage, many of the trees being used as argument against this change, will of necessity be removed in a short time. A weak argument when honestly weighed against the future value to the people that this parking lot offers. When completed and landscaped it too will add immeasurably to the aesthetic beauty of this area as well as helping to relieve the dire need of central parking.
