RO Wants State To Amend Laws

ROYAL OAK—The council here recently passed a resolution urging the state legislature to amend Sections 312-27 of the Compiled Laws of 1945 to provide that counties with less than 1 million population but more than 300,000 shall have a breakdown of supervisors as follows: 1. from 400 to 2,000—2; 2. from 2,000 to 4,000—3; 3. from 4,000 to 25,000—4; from 25,000 to 50,000—5; and for each 25,000 persons a city has over 40,000 it shall have one additional supervisor.
