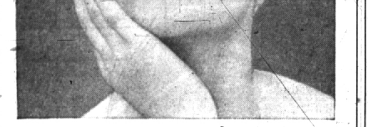
Devotions will be led by Mrs. V. Polhemus. Jack Carsteki, guest speaker, will present a travelingogue.

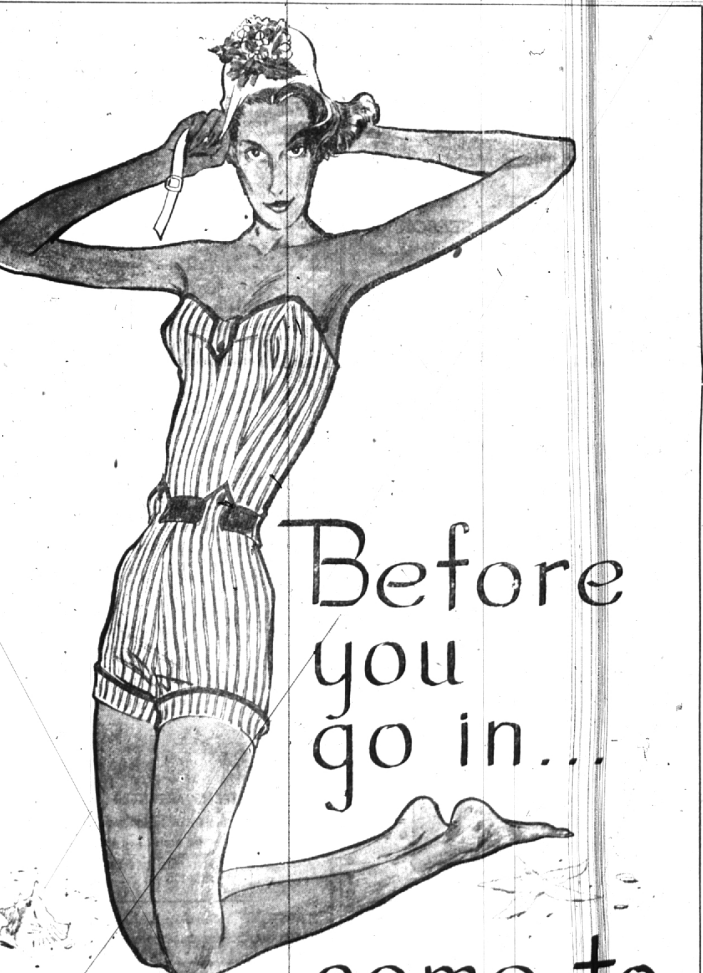
