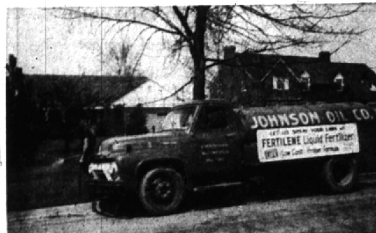


BIRMINGHAM BUSINESS BRIEFS
