

## Jail, Fine Detroit Boys for Second Liquor Violation

Two Detroit youths who were arrested last week for possession of alcoholic beverages were sentenced to one day in jail each and fined \$35 and \$10 costs each by Justice John J. Gaffill Friday.

The pair, Charles Williams, 20, and Thomas Bryant, 18, were picked up after police noticed their car had no tail light and stopped them at Arlington and Maple.

The two will spend their day in jail Sunday, May 15, according to

police, who added that this was the second such offense the youths had been involved in here. On April 17 they were arrested and Gaffill fined Williams \$35 and Bryant \$50.

Students of the survey English classes recently heard Alex Aiken, Pontiac high school janitor, when he read poems of Robert Burns in Scottish dialect.

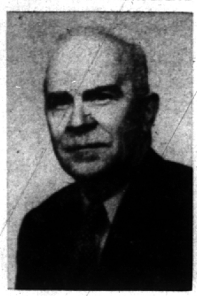
With the poetry, the group was entertained with some Scottish tales and a question and answer period.

## Detroit Edison Vice Presidents
