Among some of the other entries for Forest Lake along with 1954 winners are: Betty Jameson with \$8,740; Betty Hicks with \$7,054; Beverly Hanson with \$6,415; Jackie Pung with \$6,291; Ray Crocker with \$5,270 and Marlene Bauer with \$4,984.

Fourteen of the lady pros will grab a share of the prize money.
