

Gets 1 to 5 Years For \$1,000 Theft

Erma Senters, 34, of Detroit, was sentenced to from one to five years in jail Monday by Oakland County Circuit Judge H. Russell Holland for stealing \$1,000 worth of Dresden China from her employer, Mrs. Maude Urush of 587 Linden, April 23.

Miss Senters, who worked in the Birmingham area for two years, admitted the charge May 10. She is wanted in Detroit for violation of probation stemming from a bad check conviction, according to Police Det. Lt. Merlin Holmquist.

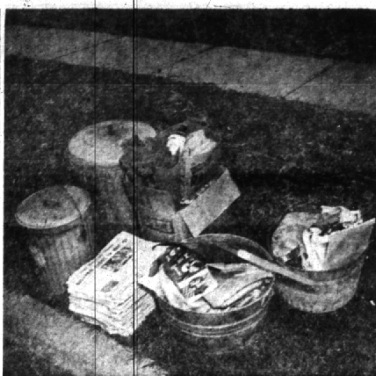
Miss Senters was ordered to the Detroit House of Correction.

Purchase of Merrill Lots Recommended

Acquisition of the tier of lots on the south side of Merrill between Henrietta and Chester was proposed by the City Planning Board Tuesday for recommendation to the City Commission.

It is being recommended by the board that the city acquire these lots to be used for off street parking, with immediate consideration given for utilizing the northern 60 feet adjacent to Merrill for parking.

This parking area would accommodate 50 cars, and the acquisition of the entire tier on Merrill would make available future parking possibilities.

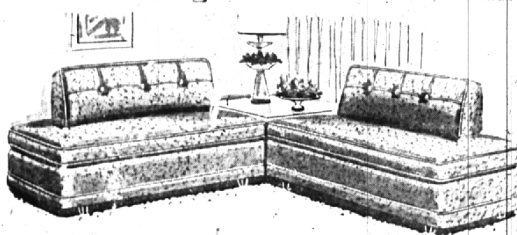

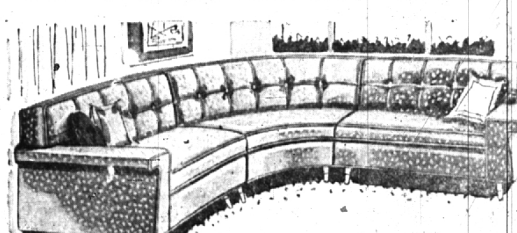

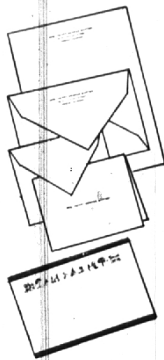
Conservation Award Goes to Adams Group
