## Displaced Child Has Friend Here

This time the child "adopted" by a Birmingham family has a very different national background. Edward Welna, 9 1/2, "adopted" by Mrs. Henry C. Johnson, Quanton road, Bloomfield Hills, is classified as a displaced Polish person in England, but is a native of Uganda, Africa.

Edward's father was wounded while serving with the Polish army and after being invalided out of service, asked to join his wife and children in a Russian labor camp. There his family was wiped out in a typhoid epidemic.

**FREED FROM** the camp he again joined the Polish forces but ill health prevented his service. He went to Uganda where he met and married another war refugee.

The family was evacuated to England in 1950 and have been supported by the National Assistance Board as Welna is unable to work. Their income, for two adults and four children, is \$18.20 per month.

Edward is partially deaf and is not a strong boy. He is a third grader in a primary school, with arithmetic his best subject.
