BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP SANITARY DEPARTMENT

ORDINANCE NO. 126
THE TOWNSHIP OF BLOOMFIELD OBTAINS:

Section 1. The Township of Bloomfield hereby establishes a sewage disposal in the Township of Bloomfield which shall include those districts of the township heretofore laid out and known as Bloomfield Drain No. 1, the Bloomfield Village Sewer Drain No. 2, for the purpose of establishing and maintaining a Sewage disposal district for the benefit of the inhabitants of that portion of the Township.

Section 2. No person or property owner shall have the right to top or make connections with any sewer or drain in the above districts without first making application therefor to the proper authority and paying to the Township Treasurer at the rate of \$10.00 for each residence or building to be served by said connection.

Section 3. The owners of all buildings built or connected with any of the sewers or drains in said district prior to September 1, 1954, shall pay to the Township Treasurer the sum of \$250.00 for each building or connection to said sewer or drain, which said sum may be paid in ten equal installments of \$25.00 each, plus interest at the rate of 4 per cent per annum on all sums unpaid, said payments to begin July 1, 1955.

Section 4. The amount so paid to the Township Treasurer shall be deposited by him in a separate fund and shall be used for the purposes outlined in the agreement between the Township and the City of Birmingham, dated September 18, 1954, providing for the township's share of the cost of the Evergreen Interceptor Sewer, including the engineering of the Birmingham Sewage Treatment Plant, whenever its increase in the judgment of the Township Board.

Section 5. The Township Treasurer shall send statements of installments and interest as set forth in Section 3 hereof and if payment is not made within six (6) months thereafter the same shall become a lien upon premises so charged and shall be collected in the same manner as other taxes are assessed, levied and collected and shall be paid in the same manner for non-payment.

Made and passed by the Bloomfield Township Board the 9th day of May, 1955.

This ordinance shall take effect after the third publication thereof according to the statute in each case made and provided.
