**1,000 Young Singers To Present Program**

One of the city's outstanding musical programs will be heard at 8 p. m., June 1, when the all-city music festival is again presented in the Birmingham high school gymnasium. The all-vocal program will include soloists, glee clubs, choruses and choirs from all schools in the Birmingham system and will include some 1,000 young singers. This is the third year for this all-city program, which has now been divided into alternate years for vocal and instrumental groups. General plans have been under the guidance of Arnold Berndt, instrumental department head of the public school system. The first program, he said, comprised the two divisions and had about 2,600 taking part. "WE HAVE decided it is better to divide the two groups," Berndt explained. "In that way we are able to present a better example of the splendid work these boys and girls are doing—and they are good. Birmingham, as a school system and as a city, can well be proud of all these young musicians." Final preparations will be a mass rehearsal for all groups on May 31. Berndt promises a brilliant spectacle when the young singers, girls in gaily colored dresses, boys in white shirts and dark trousers, take the stage. The various levels of musical achievement will be shown from grades five through 12 as combined groups in each grade level present their portions of the program. SEVERAL PORTIONS of the program will be directed by music teachers, including Mafian Olds, Pembroke and Beverly who will direct the fifth grade singers.
