The board is to meet this week to elect its officers and to inaugurate dues-paying members invited to attend the annual meeting.

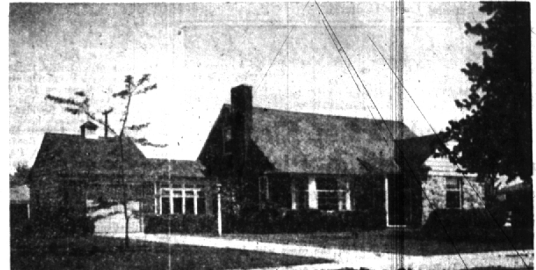

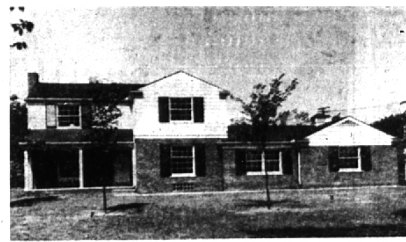
