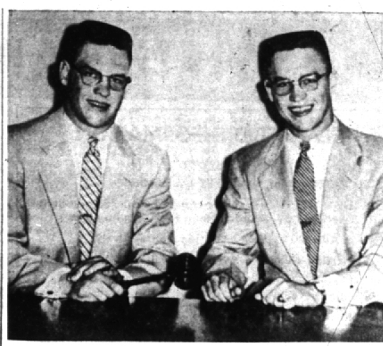

Seek Annexation Of Areas Not In Troy City Plans

With a favorable vote expected for incorporation in Troy township, the city commission has concerned itself with the possible annexations of three areas which have not been included in the incorporation plans.

These areas would be isolated from the proposed new city of Troy and they are either partially or completely surrounded by corporate limits of the city of Birmingham.

THE AREAS in question include the Twining property located on the east side of Adams approximately 1,000 feet south of Maple. This property is entirely surrounded by Birmingham, and about four-fifths of a mile from the nearest property which will be in the proposed new city.

The property of the Scony Vacuum Oil company located at the corner of Woodward and 14 Mile road is surrounded on three sides by Birmingham and on the south by Royal Oak. This property is 1 1/2 miles distant from the nearest portion of the new city.

INDUSTRIAL property at the east end of Lincoln and west of the Grand Trunk Western railroad being developed by the Birmingham Road company was not included in the incorporation plans and Glenn Berry has indicated his desire for annexation to Birmingham.

The first step in the way of annexation would be the filing of petitions from these areas.
