From the sublime to the ridiculous. Referring to last week's drivel, we shall consider three approaches to the CRAB-GRASS problem:-

- 1. Killing the plants . . . We believe the best method is to spray the plants with a POTASSIUM CYA-NATE. Our choice is Bonide's CRAB-NOT.
- 2. Killing the seed as they germinate accomplished by distributing CHLORDANE or CRAG HERBICIDE on the surface of the ground about MAY 15th. (CRAG HERBICIDE should not be used unless your lawn re-seeding was done at least 7 weeks earlier.)

Therefore, we recommend the application of 1 pound of 10-6-1 (WOODRUFF'S GRO-SOD, STAD-LER'S XXX or AGRICO'S TUFF & HORT.) per 100 sq. ft. on June 1st, July 1st and Aug. 1st.

Water it once a week and soak it to a depth of 5 to 6 inches. (If your lawn was fertilized after April 15th you may vary the above date to July 1st and August 1st.)
