St. James Announces Berkley Chapel Plans

St. James Episcopal church, only recently completing its own church building, announces its mission in Berkley. St. James Episcopal Chapel, has approved plans for a new church building, and will launch a building fund campaign. The plans are the creation of James F. Abbott, Birmingham architect and builder, and member of the vestry of St. James' church.

The Birmingham church, the Rev. Harold E. Towne, rector, began the Berkley Mission in March of 1952 by providing services, either aid and guidance until the mission could stand by itself.

One of the great helps in the initial period was the services of the lay readers from the Birmingham church under the direction of A. Fletcher Plant, and the Altar guild under Mrs. George Mullin.

INITIAL GIFTS and aid from parish organizations and the Women's auxiliary provided the primary thrust to start the mission on its way. St. James' still provides financial aid and acts as trustee, while the chapel has assumed a good share of its own responsibilities.

The mission has grown in the period from 20 to over 100 families. Its location on 12 Mile road between Greenfield and Pierre will serve a large suburban community comprising northern Southfield township, Berkley, Lathrup Village, and parts of Oak Park and Royal Oak that border this area.

THE UNIQUE contemporary building plan projected for a four-acre plot is designed so that it can be built in units. The church will seat 500 people, and the parish hall 250. There will be 10 well lighted Sunday school classrooms, a large guild room, office space and parking for 215 cars. The total estimated cost of this complete plan is \$450,000.

At present, the first unit which will become part of the future church, will seat 150 people in a

combination chapel and parish hall, and provide six classrooms and a kitchen. The building of the first unit, which will cost \$45,000, is planned for this summer or fall.

The building fund campaign is under the direction of Telfer White of Berkley. The vicar, the Rev. Herbert Barsale, has been the minister to the chapel congregation since June of 1953.
