Road Problems of County Main Topic at LWV Meet

A large group of Walnut Lake residents attended the meeting at the West Bloomfield high school on April 26, sponsored by the League of Women Voters, when "Roads of South Oak land County" were discussed.

E. W. Campbell, traffic engineer, his family and was on hand to help describe the extensive survey which the Detroit Metropolitan Traffic Study commission has made and explained that this data, together with population forecasts, will be the basis for planning a network of arterial highways to serve the entire area.

If the federal government comes into the road picture, says Campbell, Michigan will have completed plans to present for approval.
