Accepts Medal Honoring Late Eliel Saarinen

CRANBROOK—At an informal ceremony Nov. 3 in Cranbrook House, Mrs. Eliel Saarinen accepted a posthumous Founders Medal for her late husband, world-famed Eliel Saarinen who was resident architect at Cranbrook from 1926 until his death in 1950.

Henry S. Booth, chairman of Cranbrook Foundation, made the presentation and read a resolution adopted last May 5 by the Foundation's board of trustees as follows:

"Whereas, Eliel Saarinen, being a retiring man, during his lifetime declined to be publicly honored at Cranbrook for either the architectural design of most of its buildings or his constructive participation in the development of the Cranbrook Academy of Art as an institution, and its students as creative architects and artists; and whereas, the contributions made to Cranbrook and the world by Eliel Saarinen, architect, and

Michael Vittrano on June 15 for his 50 years as head gardener, painter and tender of living things;

The second medal was received by Carl Milles in Stockholm, Sweden, just before his death there on September 12, Milles, friend and associate of Saarinen, was resident sculptor at Cranbrook Academy of Art for 21 years.

DESIGNED and executed by Marshall Fredericks, the Saarinen medal contains the inscription: "To Eliel Saarinen, who as architect of buildings and ideals, contributed much to our institutions, 1873-1950." On the reverse side are bas-relief profile portraits of George Gough Booth and his wife Ellen Scudder Booth.
