Y., and attended Pratt Institute before winning his BA from Bard school, New York. His painting, "Japanese Warrior," won the \$100 Carlos Lopez Memorial Prize.

DAVID MITCHELL, brother of Wallace Mitchell, head of the painting department at Cranbrook, and a former student there, won the Dr. and Mrs. Donald N. Morgan prize of \$200 for his "Venice". He lives on Palmer in Detroit. Cranbrook's own prize, a purchase one, was won by Ann Arbor's Jamie Ross.

The exhibition of 201 paintings includes other artists from the area, with many of the pieces for sale at studio prices. Winners were told at a dinner for exhibiting artists preceding the public reception. The exhibition will be included in the free gallery tours conducted each Sunday at 4 p.m. by the museum's curators.

Assign Architects For New Schools

Birmingham board of education assigned architects for three new elementary schools and additions to four others at their meeting Tuesday night. The Smith firm will design the Greenfield elementary and a six-room addition at Walnut school. A two-room addition at Bloomfield village school and the Pembroke school addition will be planned by Linn Smith. This firm will also get the new Harlan school job. Plans for an elementary school at the Birmingham high site and a four-room addition at Franklin school will be drawn by O'Dell, Hewitt, and Lockenbach.

A PROGRESS report on the proposed indoor-outdoor swimming pool at the high school said construction is coming along on it. The pool will be 42 by 75 with 524 seats along the west wall of the building.

Polio Vaccination Program Enlarged

The polio vaccination program now will include children one through 14 years and all pregnant women according to an announcement made Tuesday morning by Dr. John D. Monroe, director of the Oakland County health department. Eligibility cards no longer are necessary but third injections and boosters will not be given until the next polio season, Dr. Monroe said.
