Services Friday For Crash Victim

A Beverly Hills woman was killed Tuesday when her car was in collision with a patrol truck at Thirteen-Mile and North-western in Farmington township.

The victim, Mrs. Margerie Prescott Buell, 32, was dead on arrival at William Beaumont hospital. Her children, Mardi Jeanne, age four, and Robin Elyse, age two, were riding with her, escaped unharmed.

Mrs. Buell's husband, Webster, is a builder with offices at 4125 North Woodward, Royal Oak and she was secretary to the firm. The family lives at 15775 Birwood, Beverly Hills.

The truck driver, David Brandt, 31, of Walled Lake escaped with minor cuts and bruises. He told police Mrs. Buell ran a stop sign at the intersection. He said he swerved to avoid the crash but that she struck the truck sending it out of control and it tipped over.

Mrs. Buell, who was thrown to the pavement, was traveling east on Thirteen-Mile and Brandt was going northwest on Northwestern. The children remained in the car, a 1955 convertible.

Survivors besides her husband and children include her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Roy D. Prescott, a sister, Mrs. Willis Walstead and a brother, Ailes Prescott.

Funeral services will be conducted at 11 a.m. Friday, at St. James Episcopal church. Burial will be in Roseland Park cemetery. Arrangements by Bell chapel of the Wm. R. Hamilton Co.
