

## Two Women, Having Flown In Blazing Jet, Fly Again

"I'm home from Florida, safe and sound," said Mrs. Ben Ruhl, meaningfully referring to the ride of 35 minutes aboard a flaming airliner two weeks ago.

Mrs. Ruhl, of Puritan road, and Mrs. Gerry Meyer, of Bates, were enroute for a two weeks' stay at Naples, Fla., where both have family homes.

"It was really quite an experience," says Mrs. Ruhl, recalling how her heart pounded. "The ship was flying on its side to keep the flames away, and the crew showed us how to lock our hands behind our necks so we wouldn't snap our necks as the plane went down."

"THE CAPTAIN told us over the loudspeaker that if we tried to jump where we were, no one would have a chance," she says. He tried to reach Charlotte, N. C., 120 miles away, and finally, she says, came down just like a feather, in what he later called the best landing in his 19 years of flying.

"Within nine seconds, the 38 passengers and the crew of five were out of that plane! She says 'If we'd gone five more minutes, we'd have exploded,' the captain said, "Because the wing was already starting to buckle."

IRONICALLY, the two women and other passengers had begun the journey from Willow Run aboard an older Eastern Airlines plane, a Constellation, and because of landing gear trouble had flown back from over Cleveland to Willow Run to switch to the newer plane.

Their previous crew had enjoyed their trip on the modern Run which had gold carpets, white leather seats, and all the new safety devices. But even the fire extinguishers built into the motors couldn't put out the flames.

Mrs. Meyer, who was married by her friend, Mrs. Meyer, that traveling with her was apt to be adventurous, recalling two earlier flights when the planes had been afire, but only briefly, the two women were traveling together so that Mrs. Meyer could check on apartments they

own in Naples, and that Mrs. Ruhl could plant a garden at their home.

"IT TOOK MORE courage to get on the plane for the return trip," Mrs. Ruhl says. But when the man at the desk learned they had been aboard the fiery plane, the crew captain of the northbound plane lined up to greet Mrs. Ruhl and Mrs. Meyer and cocktails arrived by courtesy of the airlines. And it was a most uneventful trip that brought the two women back north last Saturday.

Reservations have already been made by Mr. Ruhl aboard one of the 12 Golden Falcons, for their trip south in January to spend the rest of the winter in Naples.
