A new, two-story addition to the Detroit Wabeek Bank and Trust Company of Birmingham is the first major step in the general expansion and remodeling program.

Wesley E. Smith, assistant vice-president in charge of the Birmingham branch, said "the modernization program will double our banking area and provide the newest in banking facilities for the people of Birmingham."

To Represent City At Nov. 27 Rally

Many scout troops in the Birmingham area will participate in the Recognition Day program Sunday, Nov. 27, 3:15 p.m., at the Coliseum, Michigan State Fairgrounds, when Gov. G. Mennen Williams will be honored. Honored will be all Boy Scouts and Explorers who have attained the first class rank during 1955. Each troop in the Detroit area council is invited to provide a color guard of four fully uniformed scouts or explorers.

A 12-ton vault door has been moved from the second story window to the main floor level of the two-story addition.

The door will be used to guard a new vault which is three times the size of the old vault and contains safety deposit boxes for private use.

The first floor addition will also house conference rooms for officers and clients, and private rooms for the use of renters of safety deposit boxes. All bookkeeping will be done on the second floor. The basement is to contain a lounge room for the use of the employees.

Main to Study Sewage Needs For County

Evergreen Interceptor Authority representatives of the six communities involved requested Ralph A. Main, Oakland county drain commissioner, to proceed with a survey to determine cubage needs of several county sewers aimed at the Detroit system, and report his findings at a Dec. 1 meeting in Birmingham.

Purpose of last week's meeting was to discuss with Detroit officials how much, if any, sewage that city would be able to dispose of from Oakland county.

Clyde Palmer, assistant Detroit city engineer, assured EIA officials that Detroit's treatment plant would be able to care for at least 210 cubic feet per second of sewage from Oakland county.

With a treatment plant planned eventually to serve four million, and with a peak Detroit population estimated at 2.4 million, Palmer said, it appeared certain that much of the county's immediate needs would be met.

Palmer added that Detroit might be able to accept as much as 254 cubic feet per second or more depending on other areas' needs—as yet not known.

Donald Pierce, State board of Health's chief of sewage and sewage treatment division of the engineering section, told EIA representatives that the state health department cannot accept or approve the proposed sewage systems until it is known how much cubic feet per second they will carry.

As far as the Evergreen Interceptor is concerned, 50 cubic feet per second would be immediately available, Palmer assured the group, and up to 70 in other areas outside Oakland county were to build treatment plants.

The main floor of the original building is to be completely remodeled and modernized, including all new counters, desks and equipment. The entire bank will be air conditioned.

The present stone front of the building is to be removed and replaced with new windows and granite front of modern architectural design.
