Deer Weights Vary in State

Conservation Department information gathered the last three hunting seasons shows that northern Michigan yearling buck deer average slightly over 100 pounds each while yearling bucks in the southern farm country average 130 pounds. A "yearling" is actually 1 1/2 years old, born the spring of one year and killed in its second autumn. The difference in weights is caused by poorer food conditions and tougher winters in the north.
