(Continued from Page 1, Sec. 2) later spent the years from 1925 to 1935 as professor of literature at Oberlin college of Toledo, Fran. His explorations in the Middle East during this period made him a Fellow of the Royal Geographic Society.

Since 1935 Dr. Young has had responsibility for missionary personnel under the Presbyterian Board of Foreign Missions. His work has included surveys of Korea, China, Japan, the Philippines, South America and West Africa, being director of International House Association, Inc. and now chairman of the overseas staff committee on the International Y.M.C.A.

LAST SUMMER he took a party of 32, including 15 students of the college, to Peru, Chili, Argentina and Brazil.

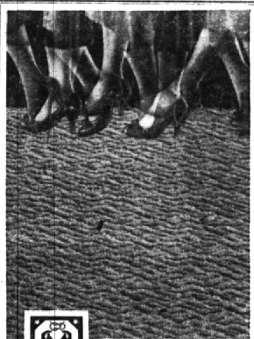
