S'fld PTA Council Shows NEA Film

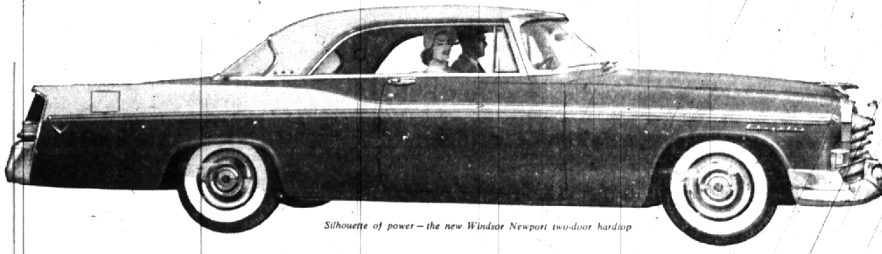
SOUTHFIELD — From November 6 to 12 schools all over the United States will be celebrating National Education Week.

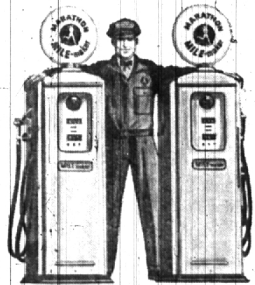

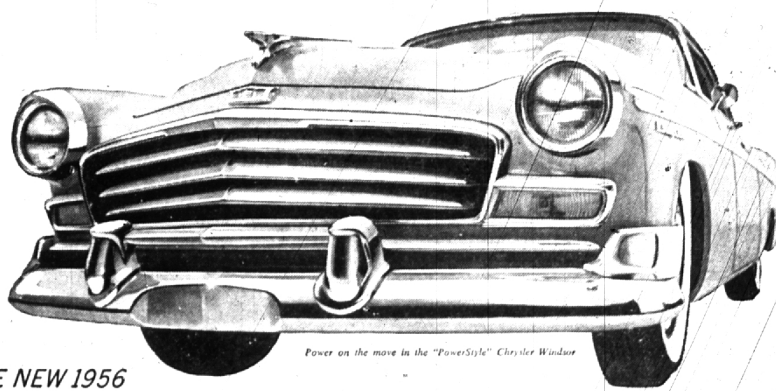
