### Pledge, Elect On Campuses

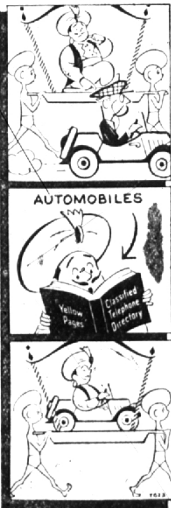
Pledging and elections highlight news of societies in colleges.
