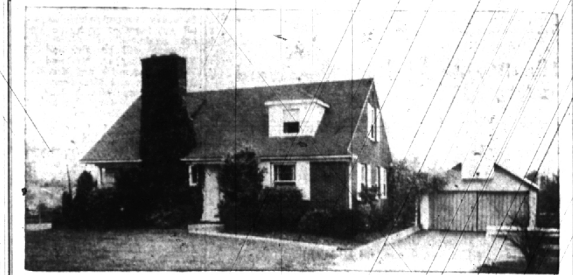
Fire Damages Home Under Construction In West Beverly
